ITEM 0 Welcome by the Chairman and Opening Remarks

Dr Mahendra Nath Pandey, Hon'ble Minister of Heavy Industries, Government of India graced the Inaugural Function as Chief Guest and Dr Hemant

Omkarrao Thakare, President-Elect, IEI, was the Guest of Honour. The mega event of the Institution was started with invocation and lighting of the lamp. Mr Dinesh Kumar, Chairman, Organizing Committee and Chairman, Delhi State Centre, IEI delivered the welcome address.

Chief Guest of the function, Dr Mahendra Nath Pandey, Hon'ble Minister of Heavy Industries, Government of India in his address focussed on the role of engineers for the development of national economy in post COVID situation. The Hon'ble Minister further mentioned the contribution of engineering fraternity towards the development of healthcare infrastructure on urgent basis during the pandemic situation. The Institution of Engineers (India) Delhi State Centre Report on the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **The Institution of Engineers (India) Delhi State Centre** ("the Institution"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2022 signed by us under reference to this report and the related Income and Expenditure Account and the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "financial statement") [in which have been incorporated the returns /accounts received from the various Local Centre's of the Institution for the year ended 31st March, 2021 as audited by other auditors and which have been relied upon by us].

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements of the Institution give the information in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles and the applicable Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and read with the Other Matters paragraph below, give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Institution as at March 31, 2022 its surplus/(deficit) and its cash flows for theyear ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SA) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Institution in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the independence requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI"s Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs and result of operation of the Institution in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the applicable Accounting Standards. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records for safeguarding the assets of the Institution and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Institutions ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Institution or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The management of the Institution is responsible for overseeing the Institutions financial reporting process.

Auditor's Report

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists.

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due
 to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain
 audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of
 not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from
 error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the
 override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal financial controls relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management use of the going concern basis of accounting
 and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to
 events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Institution's ability to continue as a
 going concern. If, we conclude that a material uncertainty exists we are required to draw
 attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such
 disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit
 evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions
 may cause the Institution to cease to continue as a going concern.
